- 1. Faculty at UCF are overburdened no one can deny that. We have almost the largest student to faculty ratio of the 600 or so registered places of higher education. The average is 14/1; UCF has 29/1. By a simple math an average faculty member.

The ratio of full-time-equivalent (FTE) students to FTE faculty at degree-granting postsecondary institutions was lower in fall 2022 than in fall 2011 (13:1 vs. 16:1). By control and level (i.e., 2-year or 4-year) of institution, the FTE student-to-faculty ratio in fall 2022 was

- 23:1 at private for-profit institutions;<sup>3</sup>
- 17:1 at public 2-year institutions;
- 14:1 at private nonprofit 2-year institutions;
- 14:1 at public 4-year institutions; and
- 10:1 at private nonprofit 4-year institutions.
- 2. This brings me to the issue of salaries, even before we talk about raises.
  We must address the issue of minimum salary for a PhD lecturer/instructor. Our sister institutions have done that. Why can't we?
